Speakers Biographies

Megan Cuzzolino

Residential Sustainability Specialist, City of Boulder's Local Environmental Action Division

Megan Cuzzolino works in the City of Boulder's Local Environmental Action Division, helping Boulder homeowners reduce their energy use and waste production. As a Residential Sustainability Specialist, Megan focuses on SmartRegs, a rental housing policy that requires all rentals in Boulder to meet an energy efficient standard. Megan comes from a background in residential development, specifically in the affordable housing realm, where she implemented green building techniques and managed related certification programs for new construction and retrofits. She is a LEED AP and holds a B.S. in geographic science with a concentration in environmental studies from James Madison University.
